1	Black Cherry <i>Prunus serotina</i>	75'	Dense foliage, white flowers in May, yellow to red in Fall, fruit provides food for birds & small animals. Resistant to walnut toxicity.	WA	FS, PS	T,S, WF
2	Pin Oak <i>Quercus palustris</i>	70'	They love the swamp! Delightful shades of red & crimson red. Rapid growing tree, strong valuable timber. Food source for numerous birds & animals.	SW	FS	T, S, WF
3	River Birch <i>Betula nigra</i>	70'	Excellent tree for low, swampy areas, tolerates standing water for weeks at a time. Fast growing, extremely heat tolerant, fall color is yellow.	SW	FS, PS	S
4	Sugar Maple <i>Acer saccharum</i>	75'	Grows on wide variety of soils, but prefers well drained soils. Nice shade tree, fairly fast growing, valuable timber.	WA, WD	FS, PS	S,T
5	White Oak <i>Quercus alba</i>	85'	Thrives on many soils types, but prefers deep moist, well drained soils. Excellent source of wildlife food. Wonderful shade tree.	WA, WD	FS, PS	T, S, WF
6	White Flowering Dogwood <i>Cornus florida</i>	25'	Showy white flowers in Spring, rich green foliage in Summer, bright red leaves in Fall, Red berries are relished by birds & animals all Winter.	WD, WA	FS	WF
7	Black Hills Spruce <i>Picea glauca 'Densata'</i>	40'	Short, stiff, bluish green needles withstands wind, heat, cold, drought & crowing. Excellent dense evergreen screen and windbreaks. Provides shelter for wildlife..	WA,	FS	WC, WB
8	Concolor Fir <i>Abies concolor</i>	75'	Beautiful Christmas tree, good needle retention, soft silvery needles, needs good drainage. Wildlife food and cover.	WD	FS, PS	WC, WF, CT
9	Eastern White Pine <i>Pinus strobus</i>	80'	Grows on most soil types, fast growing, long soft needles. Good for windbreaks and screens, wildlife food and cover.	WA	FS, PS	WB, WF, WC
10	Blue Spruce <i>Picea pungens var. glauca</i>	75'	Stiff, silvery blue-green needles prickly to touch. Dense screen, good for windbreaks, provides wildlife cover. Ordinary soils, average moisture. "King of Ornamentals"	AS	FS, PS	WB, WC, CT
11	Norway Spruce <i>Picea abies</i>	80'	Graceful very attractive, drooping branches. Thrives well in average soil conditions. Cover & Food source for numerous birds and animals. Good Christmas tree & windbreaks, resistant to walnut toxicity.	AS	FS, PS	CT, WB, WF, WC
12	Black Eyed Susan <i>Rudbeckia fulgida</i> 'Goldstrum'	2'	Long bloom, low maintenance, and easy to grow. Blooms are gold. Bloom time: July - October. Seeds attract wild birds, a favorite of wild turkeys. Spectacular in mass plantings!	WA	FS, PS	WF, B
13	Geranium 'Patricia' <i>'Geranium 'Patricia'</i>	25"	3" bright magenta blooms May - August. Thrives in poor, sandy or rocky soils with good drainage. Nice ground cover and borders. Attraction for butterflies.	TP, WD	FS, PS	GC, B
14	Iris Caesar's Brother <i>Siberian Iris</i>	36"	Velvety rich purple blooms very reliable and trouble free perennial. Attracts hummingbirds and deer resistant. Soil normal, clay and wet tolerant.	WA	FS, PS	FC, B

16	Honeycrisp Apple Tree <i>Malus domestica</i> 'Honeycrisp'	8'	Semi-dwarf, early Spring blooms of white to blush pink blossoms, sweet-tart, crisp, juicy flavor, delicious fruit. It's best to plant additional apple trees nearby to promote pollination! Harvest early September. Easy to grow!	WD	FS	HF, WF
17	Reliance Peach Tree <i>Prunus persica</i> 'Reliance'	10'	Semi -dwarf, fruit ripens July, size medium to large, produces heavy crop, self-pollinating.	WD	FS	HF, WF
18	Bartlett Pear Tree <i>Pyrus communis</i> 'Bartlett'	8'	Semi-dwarf, fast growing, adapts well to urban pollution, A large, heavy-bearing pear variety. Fruit ripens in late August. Other trees are not needed for cross pollination.	WA	FS	HF, WF
19	Lynwood Gold Forsythia <i>Forsythia x intermedia</i>	10'	Cheery brilliant yellow flowers, early Spring bloomer, good for borders. Well drained soils, fast growing.	WD	FS, PS	B
20	Eastern Red Bud <i>Cercis canadensis</i>	30'	Stunning blooms shades of pink, early Spring bloomer. Fall color is yellow. Provides wildlife food. Widely adaptable to most soils, fast growing.	WD	FS, PS	WF
21	Nannyberry <i>Viburnum lentago</i>	20'	Small white flowers April - June. Providing food source for birds, and nanny goats! Bears fruit in late Fall. Moist to dry soils.	MS, WA	FS, PS	WF
A	Bat Box	One brown bat can eat 3,000 to 7,000 mosquitoes a night! Many people think that birds such as the purple martin are the best natural defense against those tiny pests, but they are not! Bats feed when mosquitoes are most active at night. One bat box will hold up to 60 brown bats.				
B	Bluebird Box	Bluebird nesting timetable is from March 15 - June 20. The more nesting boxes you put up the more likely you are to get your NEW YORK STATE BIRD, the bluebird, in your yard.				
C	Fertilizer Tablets	Benefits: promotes vigorous growth, easy to use. Just put one tablet in planting hole, put some soil over it and then plant the tree or shrub. Time released slowly over a two year period.				
D	Marking Flags	Mark your planting so you don't mow it over! It also helps to remind you where you planted, so that you can keep weeds from taking over the young tree or shrub.				
E	Rain Gauge	Tru-Check. Wherever accurate knowledge of rainfall is important. Great gift for farmers, homeowners, greens keepers, orchardists, hobbyists, contractors and conservationists.
